

Campy fun mystery.


### The Bromance Book Club by Lyssa Kay Adams

Campy take of when an author inserts himself into a murder mystery and thinks he's smarter than the detective.


You are not Alone by Greer Hendricks and Sarah Pekkar

Beautiful historical fiction revolving around a little known fact that happened after the abolishment of slavery. Loved reading the lost letters. Great book for discussion.


We Came here to Shine by Susie Orman Schnall


#### You Had Me at Hola by Alexis Daria

Two women switch places and subsequently their lives in this suspenseful tale. Excellent read!


## The Last Train to Key West by Chanel Cleeton
